

# Sur un petit nuage

A very encompassing slouch with ribs doubled at its base. This model is knitted with two threads at the same time to combine the softness of the yarns and offer as many colors as possible. It remains extremely light and warm thanks to the combination of alpaca and silk.

This pattern is very easy, knitted in the round, it allows you to get a nice piece quickly.

Suggested size: 56 to 58 cm head circumference.



## Material :

1 kit bonnet « Sur un petit nuage » or :

1 ball d'Algasoie unie, or 1 ball d'Algasoie imprimée or 1 ball d'Algashine for its shiny side.

1 skein of Babyalpaca BC Garn .

Circular needles 4mm and circular needles 5mm, câble 60 or 80 cm.

1 stitch marker. Scissors, wool or tapestry needle, tape measure.

## Points and abbreviations :

k : knit

p : purl

K2tog : Knit 2 stitches together

\*...\*:knit the pattern between \*and\* as many times as necessary to finish the round.

m1: knit an interlayer stitch.

Ribs 1/1 : knit every rounds as this : \*k1, p1\*

stocking stitch : knit every stitches of every rounds.

Gauge : needles 5mm 10cm/10, stocking stitch : 26rounds/18 stitches.

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Work : Loosely cast on 88 stitches on 4mm needles with the 2 yarns knitted at the same time. Form the circle, put on the stitch marker to indicate the start of the round. Start knitting in 1/1 rib and continue until the top is 15cm.

Change to take the 5mm needles.

Knit the round : \*k4, m1\*, at the end of the round there are 110 stitches. Then make 3 rounds, knitting all stitches.

Knit the round : \*k5, m1\*, at the end of the round there are 132 stitches. Then make 3 rounds, knitting all stitches.

Knit the round : \*k6, m1\*, at the end of the round there are 154 stitches.

Then continue to knit all the following rounds until the total height is 30 cm (rib included) in stocking stitch.

Start decreases:

1 round \* k12, K2tog\* (143 stitches), then knit a round.

1 round \* k11, K2tog\* (132 stitches), then knit a round.

1 round \* k10, K2tog\* (121 stitches), then knit a round.

1 round \* k9, K2tog\* (110 stitches), then knit a round.

1 round \* k8, K2tog\* (99 stitches), then knit a round.

1 round \* k7, K2tog\* (88 stitches), then knit a round.

1 round \* k6, K2tog\* (77 stitches), then knit a round.

1 round \* k5, K2tog\* (66 stitches), then knit a round.

1 round \* k4, K2tog\* (55 stitches), then knit a round.

1 round \* k3, K2tog\* (44 stitches), then knit a round.

1 round \* k2, K2tog\* (33 stitches), then knit a round.

Secure the top of the hat: cut the threads about 30 cms long, put them on the wool needle and thread this needle through the remaining 33 stitches. Slip off circular needles and tighten stitches. Repeat the operation 1 time, tighten. Bring in the threads, tie a small knot in the stitches inside the hat, finish bringing in the threads, cut off the excess.

Line the ribs at the base of the cup: fold the ribs inward. Put the excess casting threads on the wool needle and sew a very soft and flexible seam to secure the ribs to the inside of the hat. Bring in the threads and cut the excess, you're done!
